Artist Residency for Middle/High School Students

Proposal for 3 separate visits of 3 days each (3 events each day)

Title of Residency: Music: the art that ties worlds together

In this Residency we take a look at how music is interconnected to various other forms of art in a multimedia experience for the students. We examine: visual art, spoken word, writings, and finally how music connects us all through the human spirit. Other topics to discuss include: techniques on memorization, practicing, performance anxiety, health and well-being, as well much more!

Visit 1: A focus on Music and its relationship with visual art

Day 1: Masterclass for piano students (all levels)

Lecture: Managing Performance Anxiety

Discussion: How do we juggle the many activities in our lives?

Day 2: Interactive Event: Match the music to the painting!

Lecture: How to organize a practice session?

Discussion: How did I begin my journey at the Piano?

Day 3: Presentation: Walkthrough of Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition

Discussion: What are your dreams/goals? Multimedia Performance: Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition

Visit 2: Literature and its connection to music

Day 1: Masterclass: for piano students (all levels)
